



## Sunnybank Primary School Sports Premium Strategy 2023-2024

### Introduction

All young people should have the opportunity to live healthy and active lives. A positive experience of sport and physical activity at a young age can build a lifetime habit of participation and is central to meeting the government's ambitions for a world-class education system. The PE and sport premium can help primary schools to achieve this aim, providing primary schools with £320m of government funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of the PE, physical activity and sport offered through their core budgets. It is allocated directly to schools so they have the flexibility to use it in the way that works best for their pupils.

#### At Sunnybank Primary School our aims are:

- ✚ For all children to take part in regular & structured physical activity & to enjoy doing so
- ✚ For children's skills & competence in physical activity to grow
- ✚ To increase pupil participation in sport
- ✚ To embed the idea that regular exercise is an essential part of healthy lifestyles

#### At Sunnybank Primary School, we use this funding in the following ways:

- ✚ Provide specialist Sports Coaching for all KS1 and 2 pupils
- ✚ Provide termly sports clubs
- ✚ Join the local School Sports Partnership in order to access local competitions and tournaments
- ✚ Provide whole school enrichment activities
- ✚ Purchasing specialist equipment & teaching resources
