Reflection

Today we learned about staying safe on the internet. We watched Mickey Mouse walk through the internet and remind us of some important rules. The internet can be a fun place to play games, watch videos, and learn new things, but it's also important to remember to be careful.

Being careful means we don't share personal information, we think before we click, and we pay attention to anything that doesn't feel quite right. It also means we remember the people we can trust — adults who can help us if we're unsure about something online.

This afternoon, you'll get to be internet detectives and practice spotting clues that help keep us safe. Even when something seems normal online, being thoughtful and careful is always the smart choice.

If anything online ever makes you feel worried, uncomfortable, or unsure, we know exactly what to do: we stop, we block, and we tell a trusted adult. Asking for help keeps us safe, and you will never get into trouble for telling.

Now, as we finish, put your head down and think quietly about one or two adults you trust — someone you can always go to if you need help online. Remember, you are safe, you are never alone, and you are always capable of making smart choices on the internet.
