



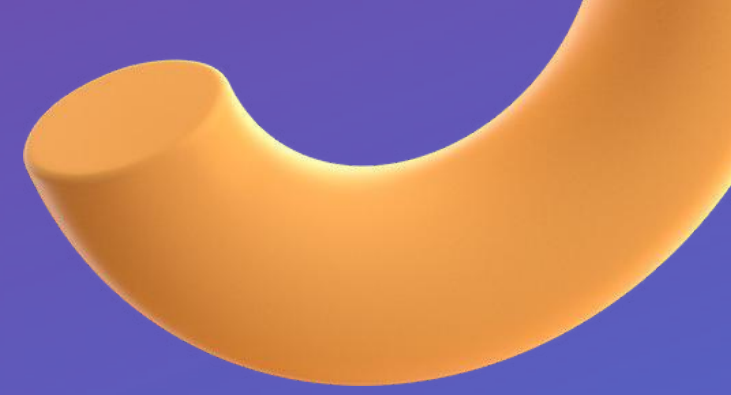

TERM 3

LITERACY

In Literacy this term the children will be looking at the book 'Where the wild things are'. The children will generate adjectives to describe all the weird and wonderful characters that Max, the main character, meets in the story. The children will use their imagination to create different solutions to help Max throughout the story and will use story mapping and role play to support their ideas. The children will retell their very own version of the story and think about the 'wild things' that they can create for their story.



Maths

In Maths the children will be learning all about measuring. They will compare the length and height of different objects and begin to learn how to measure in centimetres. They will be exposed to different Mathematical vocabulary such as heaviest, lightest, shortest and tallest. The children will also be learning how to measure and compare the mass of objects, comparing how heavy or light objects are. As this term we have our Times Table Bee, the children will also have opportunity to learn and practice their 2,5 and 10 times table.



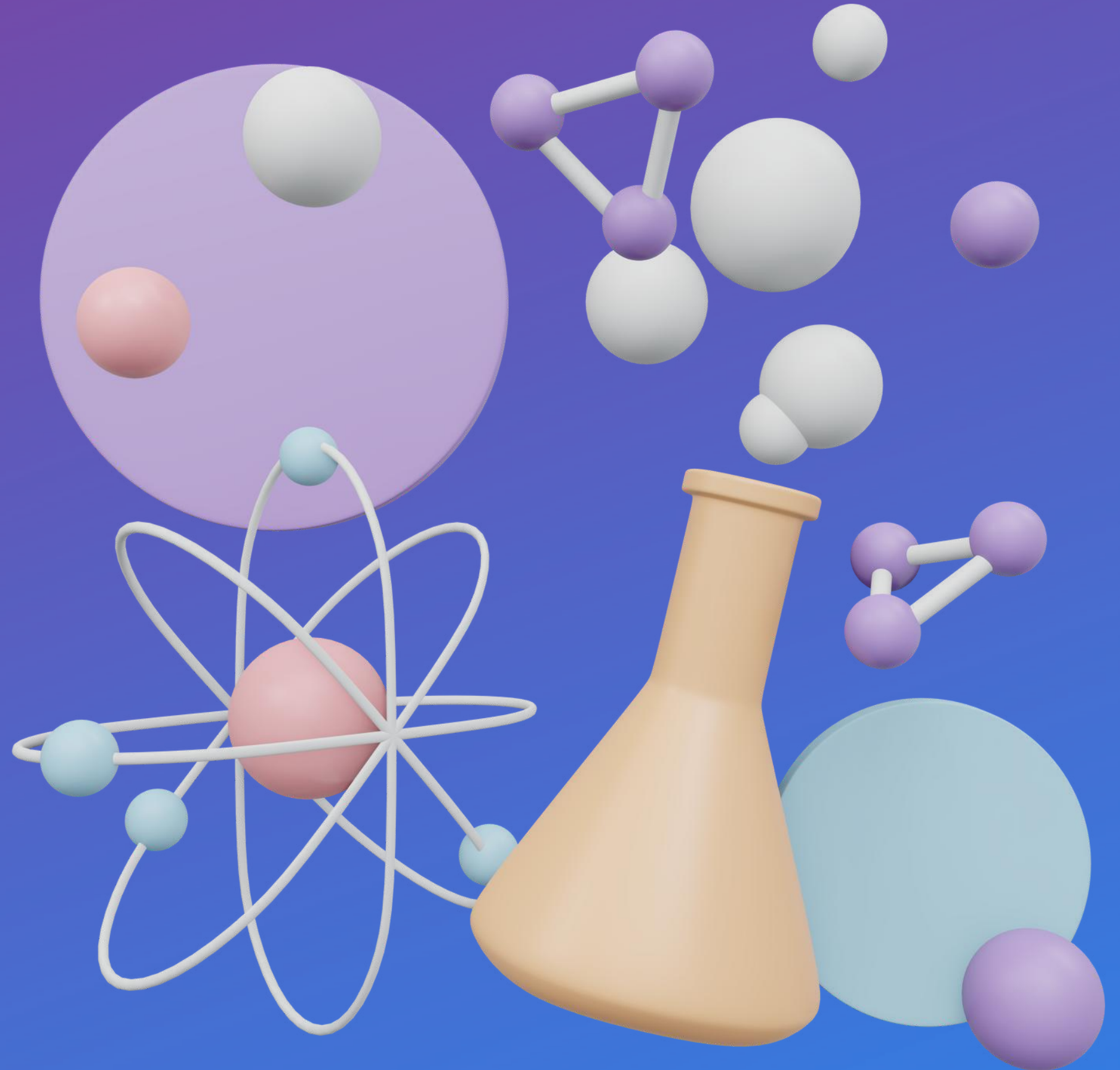

Science

The theme for science this term is 'Animals including Humans'. The children will focus this term on the Human body naming different body parts and understanding the role of a skeleton. The children will learn more about their different senses: smell, see, hear, touch and taste.



Topic

Our theme this term is 'One World' and in Birch class we will be focusing predominantly on the United Kingdom. The children will be learning where in the United Kingdom we live, as well as learning the names of the other countries that make up the United Kingdom.



Art/DT

The children will be familiarising themselves with famous buildings and comparing their structure. The children will design and build their own bridge and put it to the test to see if it is strong enough!



PE

The children will be participating in a range of ball skills this term. They will also be participating in gymnastics. PE is on a Monday indoors and Thursday outdoors so please ensure children have suitable PE kit.



Music

This term the children will build on their prior learning of Rhythm and Pulse. They will be learning more about Jazz music and the influence that Louis Armstrong has had on this genre of music.



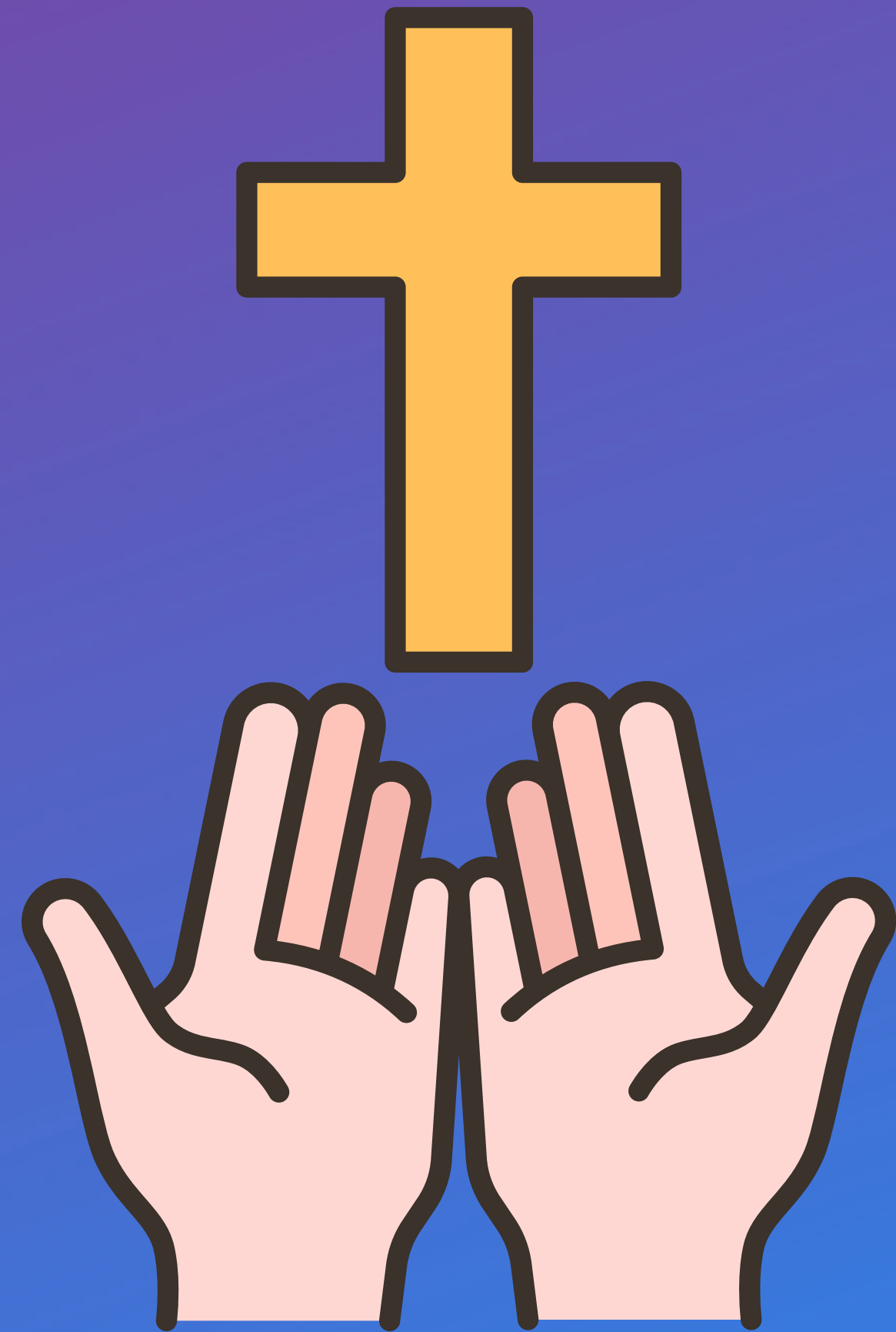
Computing
