

LITERACY



I am very excited about this term's Literacy as we are using the book 'The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark.' To help the children write a non-chronological report, I have booked an owl visitor to come into school. The company will be bringing 5 different species of owls to fly and inform us about. We will then move onto rewriting a chapter of our story, using our own ideas.



Maths

We will start learning about multiplication and division and children will understand these concepts using the term 'groups of' and 'lots of.'

Children will be introduced to Times Tables Rock Stars and will be expected to complete 30 sessions each week at home.

We will move on to learning about money; the coins and notes we have and how to make the same amount in different ways.

We will also learn about different 2D and 3D shapes and will be able to describe their properties using mathematical vocabulary.



Homework

If your child is on AR, they should be reading and quizzing for 30 minutes a day. Children should be completing at least 2 quizzes a week. Children have targets to achieve and will receive a prize if they meet their target each term.

If your child is reading Monster Phonics books, they should be reading for 15 minutes a day, building up their sight vocabulary and fluency.

Reading – daily

Spellings – sent home termly but practiced weekly.

TTRS – complete 30 garage sessions a week

Passport to learning project – completed each week and handed in at the end of term by the deadline set.

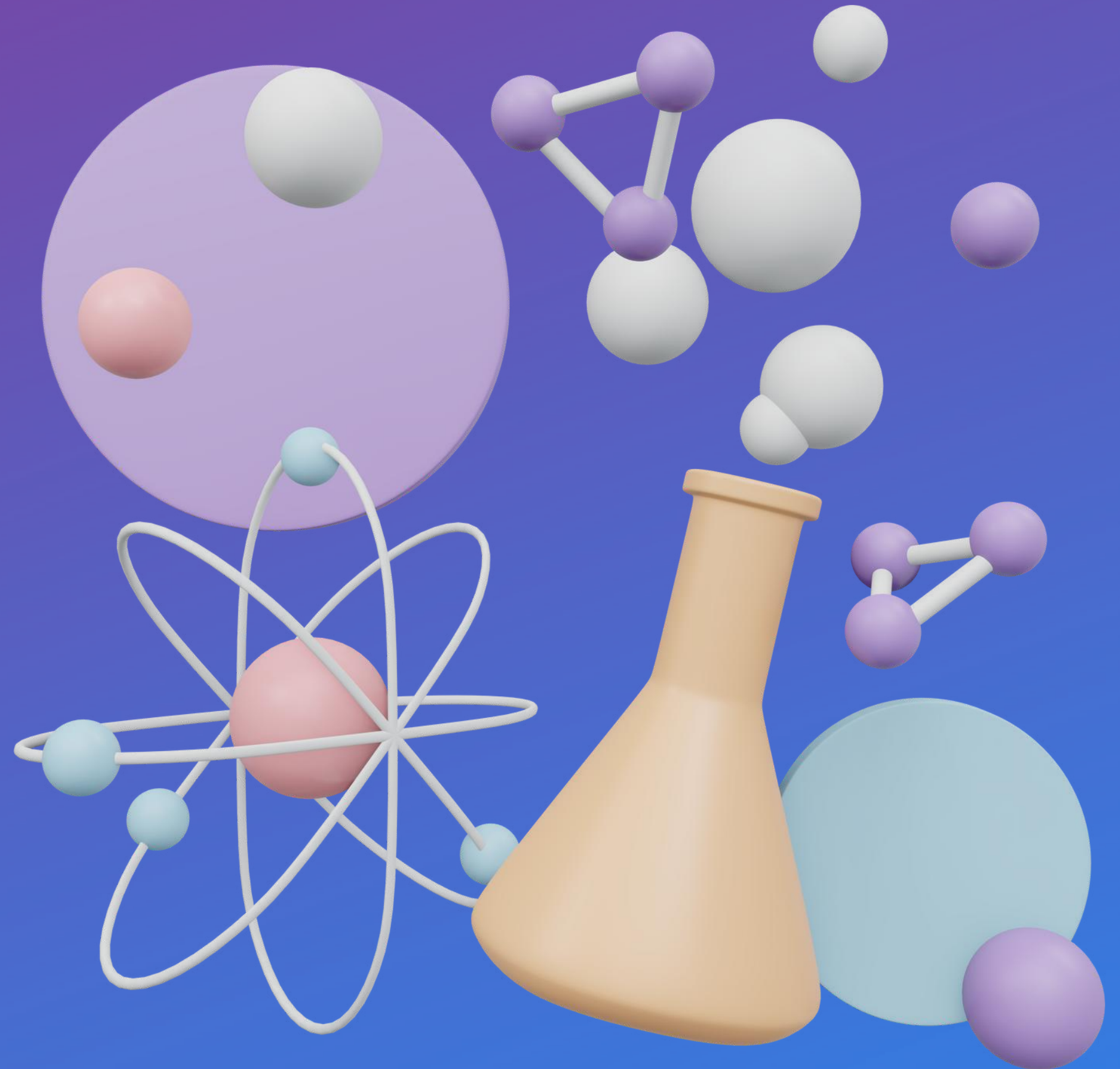

Science

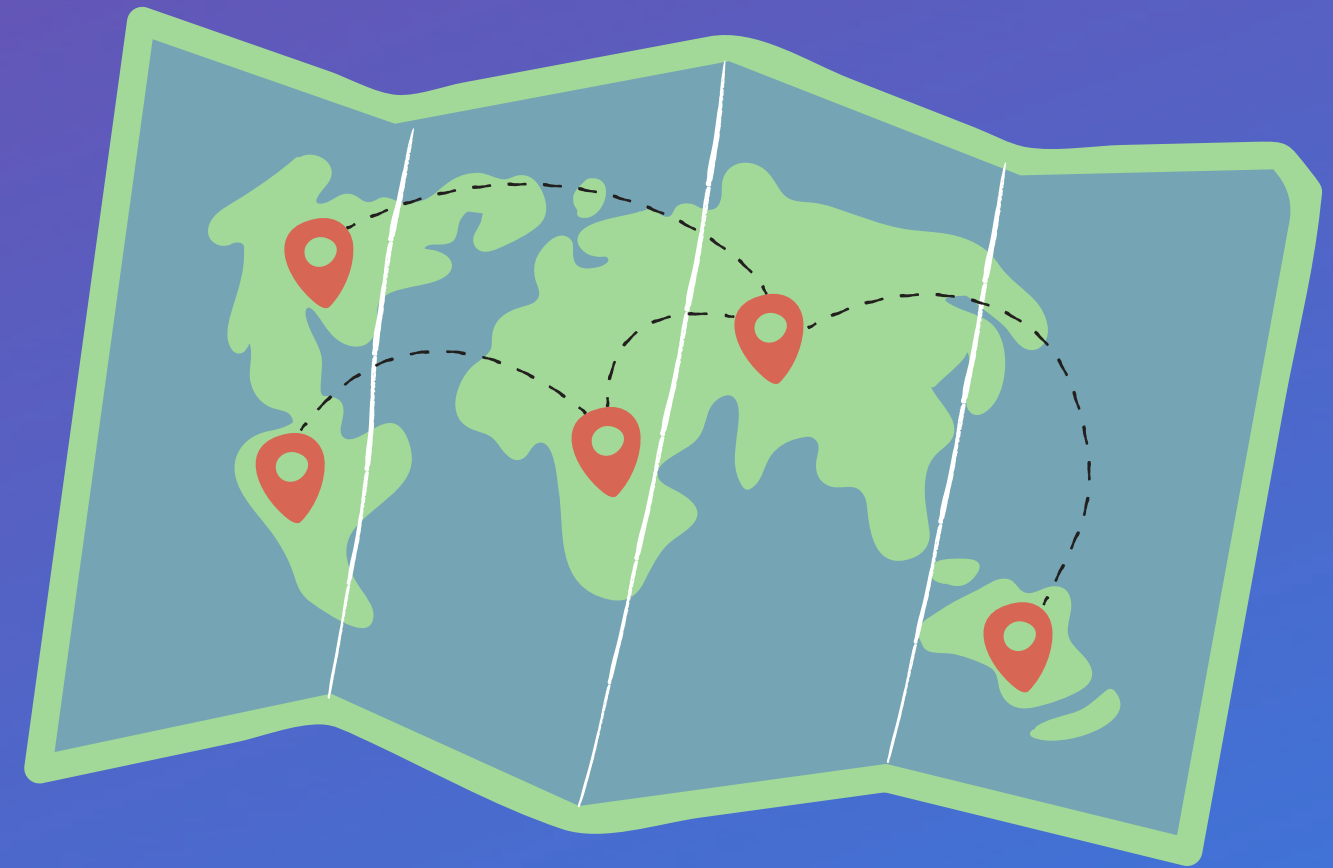
Science is full of exciting experiments around our topic of 'Materials.'

We will be setting up and carrying out experiments that include bending, twisting and stretching different objects made from a range of materials.



Topic

This term children will be learning about continents and seas. They will use maps and atlases to find out where they are in the world. They will explore coast and cities identifying the human and physical features of a place.



DT

Children will learn how to make three different mechanisms to create their own moving jungle animal pictures!



Music

Our unit this term is called 'Grandma's rap.' This unit explores beat and rhythm work using crotchets and quavers. Beginning with on-the-spot actions, followed by stepping the durations, stick notation is introduced and pupils go on to create their own 4-beat patterns, which they will perform the rap to.



Computing

Internet safety and screen time are vitally important for our young people. We will be taking a thoughtful look into how we keep ourselves safe online and spend our time on our devices. In addition, children will be discovering the world of digital photography.

Children will be thinking about what God means to them. They will be learning about the Muslim faith. They will learn about how a Muslim might describe their God and the importance of the Prophet Muhammad and find out more about their holy book, the Holy Qur'an
