# LITERACY

In literacy, children will learn to write informal letters, descriptions, and balanced arguments based on the story *The True Story of the Three Little Pigs* by Jon Scieszka. They will apply key Year 5 skills such as using ambitious vocabulary, organising ideas into clear paragraphs, using a range of punctuation, and developing their writing with detail and cohesion.



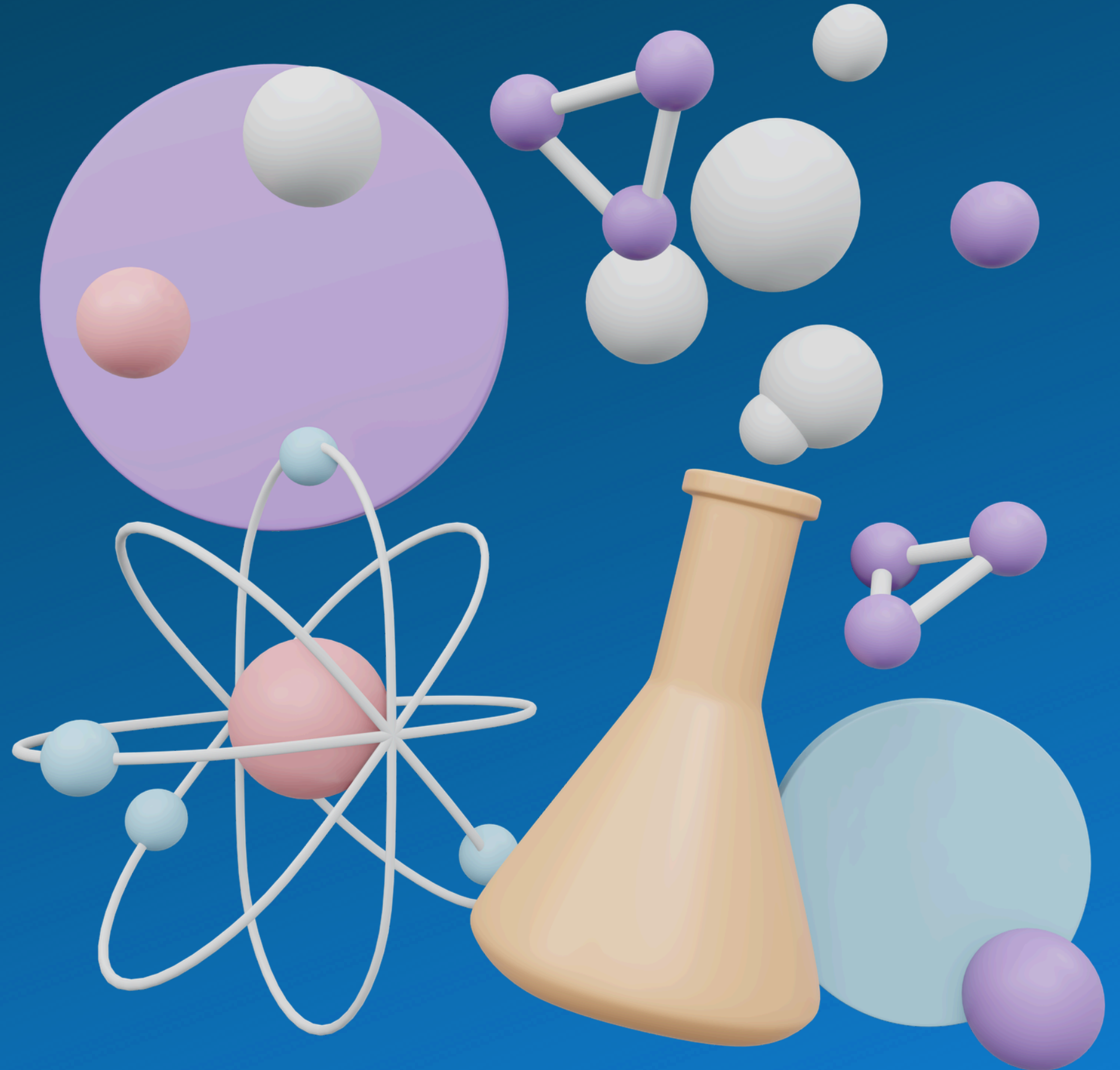
# Maths

In Maths, children will focus on geometry and position and direction, as well as revising and consolidating key skills from across the year. They learn to describe positions using coordinates, understand translations, and develop their problem-solving and reasoning skills. There is also time spent revisiting areas such as fractions, decimals, and measurement to strengthen confidence before moving into Year 6.



# Science

Human development. Children will learn about animals, including humans, focusing on how living things grow, develop and survive. They will study life cycles in animals and people. In addition, they will explore how animals reproduce and understand the importance of staying healthy through good habits such as diet, exercise, and hygiene.



# Topic

In this unit, children will learn about natural resources and how they are used around the world. They will explore how resource use has changed, study examples from different countries, and consider how resources can be used more sustainably.



# DT

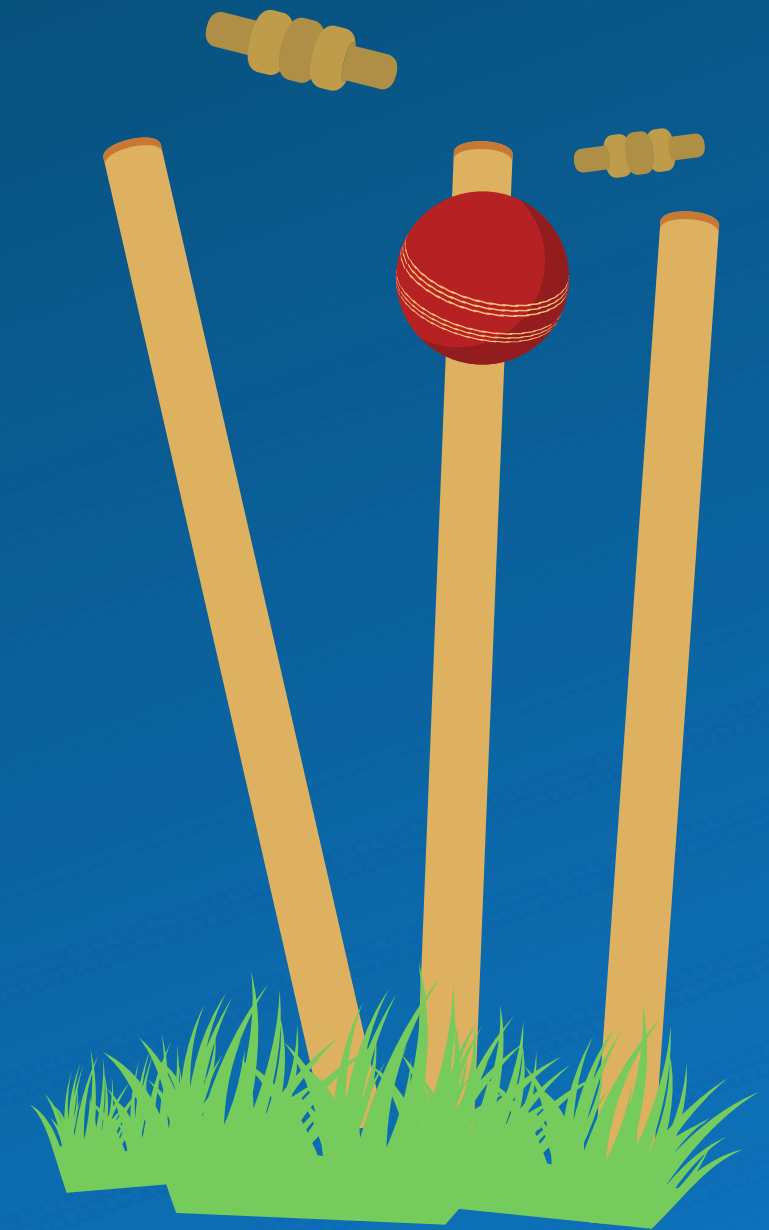
Children will learn about food and nutrition through the context of cooking. They will explore where their food comes from by understanding the process of beef production. Pupils will also research traditional recipes and think about how they can be adapted to be healthier.

# Music

Children will develop their singing, playing, and composing skills. They will learn to perform confidently in time with others, explore how music is structured using different types of notation, and create their own melodies. They will also work together to compose and perform a group piece, sharing their ideas creatively.



# RE

Stand up for what you believe in  
Children will explore how religion can influence people's lives and experiences. They will learn about challenges linked to religious beliefs and discuss ways to promote respect and positive change. Pupils will consider different viewpoints and begin to understand important ideas such as bias, stereotypes, and prejudice, while thinking about issues of religious freedom today.



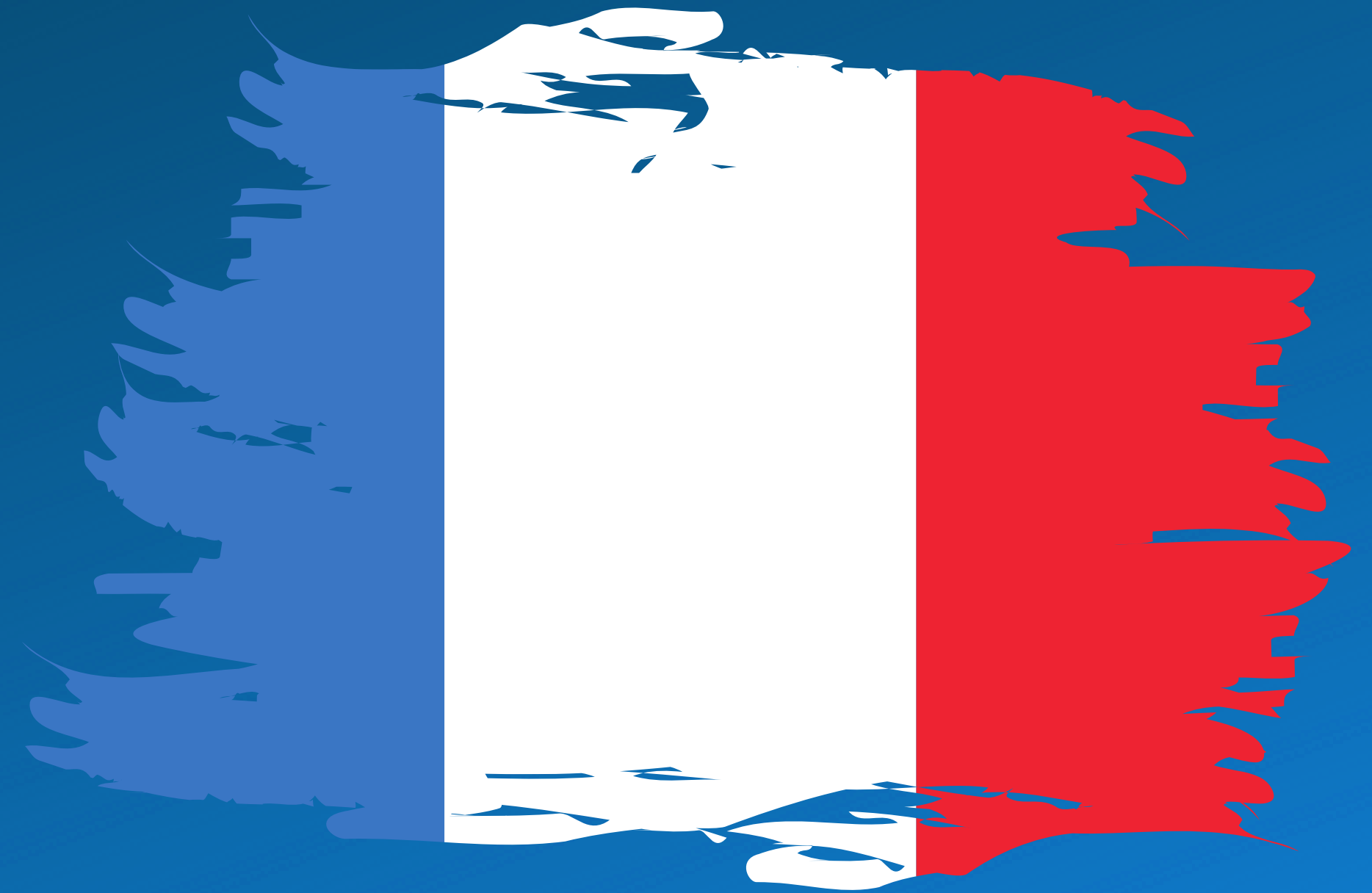
# Computing

Children will learn about the Mars Rover and how it collects and sends data back to Earth. They will explore how computers work using inputs, processes, and outputs, and develop their understanding of binary numbers and coding systems such as ASCII.



# French

Children will develop their confidence in using French verbs. They will practise reading and using them in simple phrases, including giving opinions, and learn key verbs such as avoir and être. By the end, they will work together to create short spoken and written pieces using a range of verbs.
